The project aims:

To improve health and well-being of residents with respiratory illness in Belfast

To reach the most vulnerable groups in Belfast

To promote access to energy efficiency schemes



All householders are provided with advice on saving energy in their home.



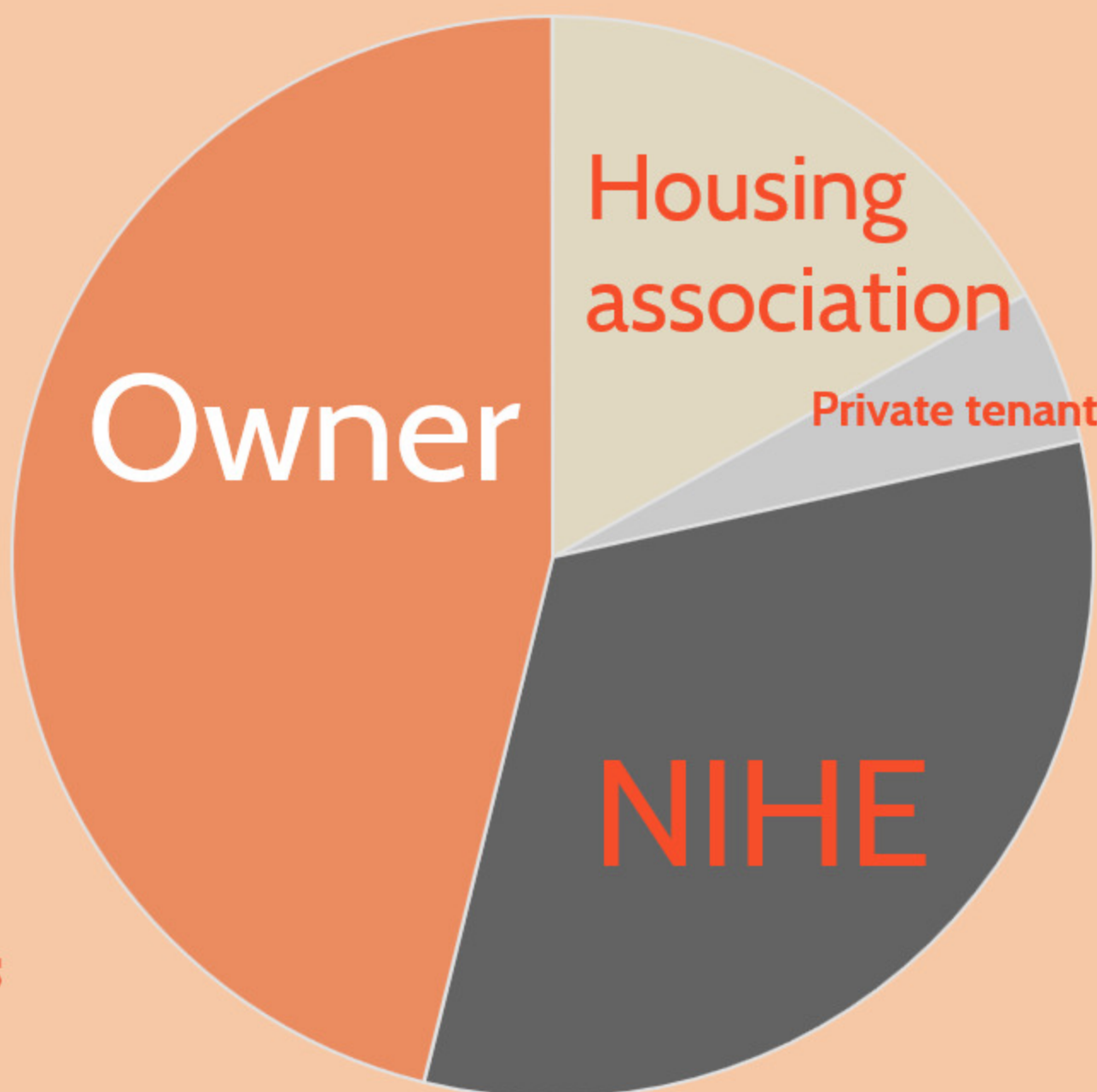
67 referrals received

over 50% referred to energy efficiency schemes

over 50% referred for Benefit entitlement checks

over 60% referred for home safety checks

All staff within the respiratory team have received training on fuel poverty and energy awareness



Tenure of clients

1. All clients receive a full assessment of their home energy needs.
2. NEA make any referrals necessary and provide hand-holding along the way.
3. Client's are provided with an information pack and winter warmth pack
4. A follow up process ensures that clients are kept informed about the process of their grants or other measures.
